











### Interpretation:

The table provides an assessment of various parameters related to the quality of educational services offered by a institution, categorized into five levels: Excellent, Very Good, Good, Average, and Poor. Across the different aspects evaluated, the distribution varies. Notably, the curricular services provided by the teaching and office staff received a predominantly positive rating, with 42% rating it as good, followed by 35% rating it as excellent. Similarly, the timely completion of the syllabus garnered favorable responses, with 37% rating it as good and 36% as very good. However, some areas show room for improvement. For instance, while the use of teaching methods and aids was generally satisfactory, with 32% rating it as excellent and 32% as very good, there were a notable 3% who rated it as average. Moreover, in terms of facilities, the availability of computer and internet services received mixed reviews, with 43% rating it as good but 10% rating it as excellent, 10% as average, and 7% as poor. Similarly, the sports facility had a significant proportion rating it as good (38%) but also a notable 7% rating it as poor. Overall, while there are areas of strength, there are also areas where improvements could enhance the overall quality of services provided by the institution





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

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







Similarly, while a majority agrees that the course/syllabus strikes a good balance between theory and practical components (20% strongly agree, 72.5% agree), there are slight reservations expressed with 7.5% neutral.





Furthermore, the majority acknowledges that the course/syllabus enhances their knowledge and perspective in the subject area (27.5% strongly agree, 67.5% agree). However, there are areas where opinions are more divided, such as the relevance of prescribed reference materials, with 15% strongly agreeing and 82.5% agreeing, suggesting some variability in perceptions. Overall, the data suggests a generally positive outlook among teachers towards the curriculum, with strong agreement across most parameters, though there are areas of mild divergence in opinion, particularly regarding the balance between theory and practical components.



Development of interest in the medical profession and inclination towards higher education and research in the medical field receives mixed feedback, with 23.08% rating it as excellent, 73.07% as good, and 3.85% as average. Similarly, cooperation from administrative and teaching staff is predominantly rated as good (76.92%), with 15.39% rating it as excellent. Ethical values, sense of social responsibility, and decision-making ability cultivated by medical education receive varied ratings, with 46.15% rating it as good and 30.77% as average. Lastly, activities offered by the college, both curricular and extracurricular, receive a relatively balanced distribution of ratings, with 34.62% rating them as excellent, 26.92% as good, and 38.46% as average. Overall, the data suggests a mixed perception of the college's efforts in student development, with some areas receiving high praise while others show room for improvement, particularly in providing advanced teaching facilities and resources.

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


