Sir/Madam,

I am directed to refer to the Ministry’s letter No. R.14014/264/2019-EP(1) dated 18.07.2019 related to admission matter for the academic year 2019-20, intimating certain requirements to be fulfilled by the college for consideration of permission for the academic session 2020-21.

2. Further, refer to the CCIM’s letter No.Ref.3-3/2020-Ay. (48) dated 12.11.2020 forwarding therewith recommendation of the college to the Central Government based on thorough examination of the visitation report Part-I, indemnity bond, affidavit & latest details of teaching, non-teaching and hospital staff submitted by the college along with the assessment report, as the physical verification by conduction of inspection could not be carried out in view of present COVID-19 pandemic situation for the A. Y. 2020-21.

3. In compliance to Ministry’s letter dated 20.11.2020, CCIM had carried out an inspection of the institution on 01.01.2021 to reassess the available facilities of teaching and practical training as well as to verify the compliance submitted by the college and forwarded its recommendations and report to the Ministry. On examining the same, it is found that, the college is not fulfilling the requirement related to Website as specified in sub-regulation (2) of regulation 9 of RMS, 2016 and therefore, an opportunity for Hearing/Compliance to update the website by 20.01.2021 was granted to the college under the provision of IMCC Act, 1970.

4. The Compliance submitted by the college and recommendations & assessment report of the CCIM have been carefully examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made thereunder and it is found that the College is fulfilling notified and approved criterion for granting Conditional Permission for UG (BAMS) course and 06 PG courses..

5. It has, therefore, been decided by the Central Government to grant Conditional Permission to "Hon. Shri Annasaheb Dange Ayurved Medical College, A/P- Ashta Tal- Walwa Dist- Sangli- 416301, Maharashtra" for conducting 100 seats in UG (BAMS) Course and 31 seats in 06 PG courses namely (i) Panchkarma- 03 seats (ii) Kaumarbhritya- Balroga-05 seats (iii) Shalya Tantra- 05 seats (instead of 10 seats) (iv) Kayachikitsa- 06 seats (v) Prasuti avam Stri Roga- 06 seats and (vi) Shalakyia Tantra-06 seats for the academic session 2020-21 under Section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act, 1970, subject to the following:

- i. The fulfillment of conditions as specified in the Undertaking/Indemnity bond submitted by the college
- ii. The college shall submit an undertaking in form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provident Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.

6. It is further informed that minimum of 15% of undergraduate of the permitted intake capacity of 100 UG seats and 15% of permitted intake capacity of 31 PG seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority of State/UT Government as designated by Central Government vide letter F.No.L.11011/02/2020-EP (1) dated 26.10.2020 for A.Y. 2020-21 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

7. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under IMCC Act & Regulations made thereunder.

8. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Board of Governors, CCIM and the Central Government.

9. As per clause 3(1)(a) if IMCC, MSR Regulations, 2016, the following requirements which are required to be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2020, will be examined for considering the permission for the session 2021-22:


- (i) all the Requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
- (ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 for grant of permission to PG courses.
- (iii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda); and
- (iv) all the requirements under the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled *in toto*



2. The CCIM had carried out an inspection of the institution on 30-31-01.2015 to reassess the available facilities of teaching and practical training as well as to verify the compliance submitted by the college and forwarded its recommendations and report to this Ministry.

3. The recommendations and visitation report of the CCIM have been carefully examined in terms of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standard Requirements of Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2012 read with amendment Regulations of 2013, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made thereunder and as per approval of the Hon'ble MoS (IC) for the UG/PG course(s) for grant of conditional permission for the academic session 2015-16 vide Ministry letter No.R.11011/01/2015-EP (IM-1) dated 05.05.2015 (available at Ministry's website <indianmedicine.nic.in>) and it is found that the College is fulfilling the notified and approved criteria as follows:-

- a. For UG course: 100% eligible teachers, 15 Higher Faculties (Professor + Reader) in 14 Departments in the college, 1 P/R + 1L in each of 13 Dept. & 1P+1R+1L in Kayachikitsa and 1L of Sanskrit and 09 part time teachers up to 60 UG seats;

 - (iv) Equipment and instruments: Minimum 90% of required equipment as specified under the schedule VII of MSR;
 - (v) Fulfillment of provisions including staff requirement under relevant PG Education Regulations; and
 - (vii) Other infrastructure and staff required as per the MSR Regulations of 2012 read with amendment Regulations of 2013, in addition to above requirements for grant of permission for a period not exceeding five years.

4. It has, therefore, been decided by the Central Government to *grant permission* under section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act, 1970 *for a period not exceeding five years* to Hon. Shri Annasaheb Dange Ayurved Medical College, A/P-Ashta Tal- Walwa Dist- Sangli- 416301, Maharashtra with 60 seats in BAMS (UG) course and 64 seats in 12 PG courses viz. (i) Panchkarma-03 seats, (ii) Kaumarbhritya- Balroga-05 seats, (iii) Sangyahan-05 seats, (iv) Rachana Sitarir-06 seats, (v) Kriya Sharir -05 seats (vi) Rasashastra evum Bhaishajya Kalpna-05 seats, (vii) Shalya Tantra-05 seats, (viii) Ayurved Samhita Siddhanti- 06 seats, (ix) Kayachikitsa-06 seats, (x) Rog Nidan avam Vikriti Vigyan-06 seats, (xi) Prasuti Tantra avam Striroga -06 and (xii) Shalaky Tantra -06 seats *from the academic session 2015-16 to the academic session 2019-2020*, during which the college shall not be inspected, except for random checks on receipt of any complaint, or otherwise as deemed necessary either by the Central Government or by the Central Council of Indian Medicine as specified in Sub-Regulation (2) of Regulation 3 of the Regulations namely the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standard Requirements of Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2012" read with amendment Regulations, 2013.



Sir/Madam,

I am directed to refer to Ministry's letter of even number dated 18.07.2019, wherein your college was granted Conditional permission for admission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and denied permission to conduct 36 seats 06 PG courses namely (i) Panchkarma-03 seats, (ii) Kaumarbharitya-Balroga-05 seats (iii) Shalya Tantra- 10 seats (iv) Kayachikitsa-06 seats (v) Prasuti avam Stri Roga-06 seats (vi) Shalakyia Tantra-06 seats for the academic session 2019-20, after examining CCIM's recommendation, vide letter No.3-3/2019-Ay.(48) dated 28.05.2019.

2. In view of your representation dated 14/08/2019, the matter was referred to the CCIM for clarification. On examining the clarification furnished by the CCIM, vide its letter dated 19/08/2019, it is found, that the said college is fulfilling the norms for granting conditional permission (permission for a period of one year) for the academic year 2019-20, as per sub-regulation (3) of regulation 3 of RMS, 2016, IMCC Post graduate (Ayurveda) regulations, 2016 and as per approved Standard Operative Procedures (SOPs) for conducting 31 seats in 06 PG courses for the academic year 2019-20.

3. Accordingly, it has been decided by the Central Government to grant conditional permission to **Hon. Shri Annasaheb Dange Ayurved Medical College, A/P-Ashta Tal-Walwa, Dist- Sangli-416301, Maharashtra** to conduct **31 seats 06 PG courses** namely (i) Panchkarma-03 seats, (ii) Kaumarbharitya-Balroga-05 seats (iii) Shalya Tantra- 05 seats (iv) Kayachikitsa-06 seats (v) Prasuti avam Stri Roga-06 seats (vi) Shalakyia Tantra-06 seats for the academic session 2019-20 under section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act, 1970 subject to following conditions:

- i. The college shall submit an undertaking in form of affidavit duly notarized within one month from the date of issue of this letter explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provident Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.

- ii. The colleges shall submit undertaking in the form of Affidavit duly notarized to get permanent registration of the Teachers/Hospital Clinical Staff/Consultant in concerned State Boards/Council where the college/hospital is located or Central Registration of the CCIM by 31st December, 2019 as per the decisions conveyed vide letters 22.03.2019 & 22.04.2019 by CCIM and decided by the High Court of Delhi in W.P. No. 2369 of 2019, which will be verified by the Council during next visitation while considering the matter for grant/denial of permission for the academic year 2020-21.
4. It is further informed that 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of **31 seats in 06 PG** courses shall be treated as All-India quota. The counseling for seats under All-India quotas shall be conducted by the Central Government and counseling for the remaining 85% seats shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State. If any seats are not filled up in the Central Counseling, the same shall be transferred to the said Counseling Authority to admit students as per their rules/ reservation policies/norms. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the Central counseling for all India quota or the students admitted there-under.**
5. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under IMCC Act & Regulations made thereunder.
6. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of CCIM and the Central Government.
7. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2019 to get conditional permission for the session 2020-21:
- all the Requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
 - all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
 - all the requirements under the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled *in toto*; and
 - all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 for grant of permission to PG courses.
8. The fulfillment of the above mentioned conditions will be verified by the CCIM by means of an inspection and CCIM will submit a report along with its assessment in this matter to the Ministry of AYUSH for considering the permission matter from the academic session 2020-21.
9. Earlier order issued vide letter of even number dated 18.07.2019, stands amended to the effect.



Sub: Withdrawal of 05 year permission granted from academic session 2015-16 to 2019-20
vide Ministry of AYUSH order dated 01.10.2015 & 25.09.2017 **and Grant of Conditional Permission to the Hon. Shri Annasaheb Dange Ayurved Medical College, A/P-Ashta Tal-Walwa, Dist- Sangli-416301, Maharashtra with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and denial of permission for conducting 36 seats in 06 PG courses i.e. (i) Panchkarma-03 seats, (ii) Kaumarbhritya-Balroga-05 seats (iii) Shalya Tantra- 10 seats (iv) Kayachikitsa-06 seats (v) Prasuti avam Stri Roga-06 seats (vi) Shalakyia Tantra-06 seats for the academic session 2019-20** under section 13A/13C of the IMCC Act, 1970-reg.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to refer to the Ministry's order F.No.R.17011/159/2015-EP(IM-1) dated 01.10.2015 related to admission matter for a period not exceeding 5 years from the academic session **2015-16 to 2019-20** intimating that the college shall maintain all the Requirements of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as per extant regulations *in toto* during the permission period (2015-16 to 2019-20) and Ministry's letter of Permission F.No.R.13011/23/2016-EP(IM-1) dated 25.09.2017 related to increase admission capacity from 60 to 100 seats in existing UG (BAMS) Course from academic session 2017-18 under Section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act, 1970.

2. The CCIM had carried out an inspection of the institution on 08-09.03.2019 to reassess the available facilities of teaching and practical training as well as to verify the compliance submitted by the college and forwarded its recommendations and report to the Ministry. On examining the same, certain deficiencies have been observed and therefore, under provisions of the first proviso to sub-section (5) of Section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970, an opportunity of hearing was granted to the college on 25.06.2019 to present the case.

3. The observations of hearing committee based on submission made by the college representatives during hearing and recommendations & visitation report of the CCIM have been carefully examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the “Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda colleges and attached Hospitals and Post graduate Ayurveda Medical Education) Regulations, 2016”, provisions under the IMCC

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Act, 1970, relevant regulations made there under and as per approved Standard Operative Procedures (SOPs) and it is found that the college is not fulfilling all the norms of notified Regulations for granting permission for a period of five years (100% criteria). However, the said college is **fulfilling the norms for granting conditional permission** (permission for a period of one year) **for UG (BAMS) course and not fulfilling notified and approved criteria for 06 PG courses** for the academic year 2019-20.

4. It has, therefore, been decided by the Central Government to **withdraw permission granted for a period not exceeding 5 years from the academic session 2015-16 to 2019-20** vide orders dated 01.10.2015 & 25.09.2017 **and grant Conditional Permission to Hon. Shri Annasaheb Dange Ayurved Medical College, A/P-Ashta Tal-Walwa, Dist- Sangli-416301, Maharashtra for conducting 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and denial of permission for conducting 36 seats in 06 PG courses** i.e. (i) Panchkarma-03 seats, (ii) Kaumarbhritya-Balroga-05 seats (iii) Shalya Tantra- 10 seats (iv) Kayachikitsa-06 seats (v) Prasuti avam Stri Roga-06 seats (vi) Shalakyta Tantra-06 seats **due to non-availability of required number of Clinical Registrar or Senior Residents or Residents Doctors , required number of House Officer, Required no of Beds in the Hospital** as per IMCC PG Ayurveda regulation, 2016 **for the academic session 2019-20** under Section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act, 1970, subject to following conditions:

- i. The college shall submit an undertaking in form of affidavit duly notarized within one month from the date of issue of this letter explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provident Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
- ii. The colleges shall submit undertaking in the form of Affidavit duly notarized to get permanent registration of the Teachers/Hospital Clinical Staff/Consultant in concerned State Boards/Council where the college/hospital is located or Central Registration of the CCIM by 31st December, 2019 as per the decisions conveyed vide letters 22.03.2019 & 22.04.2019 by CCIM and decided by the High Court of Delhi in W.P. No. 2369 of 2019, which will be verified by the Council during next visitation while considering the matter for grant/denial of permission for the academic year 2020-21.

5. It is further informed that 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 UG seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quotas shall be conducted by the Central Government and counseling for the remaining 85% seats shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State. If any seats are not filled up in the Central Counseling, the same shall be transferred to the said Counseling Authority to admit students as per their rules/ reservation policies/norms. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the Central counseling for all India quota or the students admitted there under.**

6. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under IMCC Act & Regulations made there under.

7. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of CCIM and the Central Government.

8. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2019 to get permission for the session 2020-21:

- (i) all the Requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council

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
(Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;

- (ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
- (iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled *in toto*; and
- (iv) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 for grant of permission to PG courses.

9. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to CCIM under intimation to this Ministry. The CCIM will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled by means of an inspection and submit a report along with its assessment in this matter to the Ministry of AYUSH for considering the permission matter from the academic session 2020-21.

10. This issues with the approval of Competent Authority.


